Meet New Council Member Christopher Simpson

On May 16, Azle City Council swore in a new council member, Christopher Simpson. Christopher ran unopposed in the May election and filled the spot vacated by Councilmember Paul Crabtree. He joins council members Dr. William Chambers, David McClure, Rouel Rothenberger, and Lee Barrett along with Mayor Alan Brundrett and Mayor Pro Tem Bill Jones.



Christopher is married with three children and has lived in Azle for 15 years. His children all attend Azle public schools and he owns two automotive businesses in Azle.

Being a long time resident and a successful small business owner prompted Councilmember Simpson to become very involved in the community. He has served on the Planning and Zoning Board and Zoning Board of Adjustments for just over 2 years; is a staunch supporter of Azle ISD and its teachers; and volunteers for organizations like *Project Hope* which supplies backpacks and school supplies to children in the Azle ISD and provides many senior citizens with food and basic home needs. Christopher enjoys meeting and visiting with many of the Azle residents and business owners who come through the doors of businesses.

Councilmember Simpson has a deep sense of pride for Azle and a love for living and doing business here. He stated, "The pride for our city that now resonates within me sparked my interest in Azle's rules, regulations and plans. Especially important to me are the plans that involve growing our city in a way that supplies all our needs as consumers (incoming businesses and land development). I have a desire to help our city grow in a way that benefits our residents and existing businesses, but strongly keeps to the idea of maintaining that small town feeling. This desire spurred me to join the Planning and Zoning Board and Zoning Board of Adjustments; and, ultimately, a desire to serve on the Azle City Council."

Christopher stated he once heard Mayor Brundrett on the radio speaking about Azle and very clearly remembers hearing him talk about his vision for the city and how important city beautification was to him. He states, "If I am here to help push anything, that would be it - city beautification and promoting city pride and health. I'd like to do things that make our residents proud to live here." Important to Councilmember Simpson is keeping our city beautiful, finding a way to establish sidewalks and/or bike lanes, walking trails, maintaining city facilities, and continuing to back community events like Sting Fling, Music/Movie in the Park, Follow the Flag, and the Wine Crawl.

Now that he's a new council member, Christopher looks forward to forging new relationships. He is quick to point out he doesn't come to the office of council member with a certain agenda; he "just came to do my part".

You now have online access to your hourly water usage information via EyeOnWater!

On April 6, the City of Azle began upgrading all water meters to a cellular-based meter reading system. This new system allows water meters to be read remotely using cellular-based technology that will interface directly with the City's utility billing system; increasing efficiency, improving leak



detection, and allowing the City to provide better service to our customers.

The majority of meters have now been equipped with cellular endpoints, allowing you, our utility customer, to monitor your water usage online via EyeOnWater - a secure website and smartphone app that allows you direct and secure access to your water usage data. With these tools, you are now able to view your hourly usage activity and gain greater understanding and control of the amount of water you use. You are also able to establish alerts—including identifying potential leaks.

To create your personalized EyeOnWater online account visit <u>www.eyeonwater.com/</u> <u>signup</u>.

You will need the following information to register for an online account:

- * Your utility account number
- * An email address

The mobile app is free and available through the App Store or the Google Play Store by searching "EyeOnWater".

City Monitoring for Mosquito-borne Illnesses

The City of Azle is an active member of a Mosquito Surveillance and Response Program with Tarrant County to Jili provide a more comprehensive mosquito surveillance program. Azle began trapping mosquitoes in May and will continue trapping until mosquito activity decreases. If you have concerns or would like the City to trap and test mosquitoes on your property, please call 817-444-7127.

A product for mosquito control called Altosid is a briquet containing methoprene, an insect growth regulator that stops mosquitoes from becoming breeding, biting adults. The briquet is placed in standing water, abandoned pools, and creeks or ponds and can be purchased at most home improvement stores.

Tarrant County Public Health (TCPH) has confirmed the first human case of West Nile Virus (WNV) for the 2016 season. It is very important that all of us take the necessary precautions to protect ourselves and our families from mosquito bites. Unclaimed Property

The City of Azle is currently holding property valued at \$100 or less that is presumed abandoned or unclaimed subject to Chapter 76 of the Texas Property Code. Unclaimed property may include uncashed utility refunds, vendor payments, court fees, payroll checks, or overpayments. Any person possessing a legal or beneficial interest in the reported property may obtain additional information by contacting the Finance Department at 817-444-2541. When contacting the City, please be prepared to provide the following information:

- Owner's name as identified in the unclaimed property listing
- Owner's current address
- Owner's social security number and driver's license number
- Other information as may be required to provide proof of ownership or identity
